The convening of the First Forum for Arab Universities and International Student Recruitment Agents, on 28–29 July 2025, is a timely response to this strategic need. It marks a significant step in our shared journey toward building more connected and prosperous knowledge societies. Today, the recruitment of international students is not merely a means of increasing institutional revenues—it is a powerful tool for cultural exchange, academic enrichment, and



deepening collaboration between nations.

Recent global statistics reveal that the number of internationally mobile students surpassed 6.3 million in 2024, with projections indicating this will rise to 8 million by 2030. Yet, Arab universities currently account for only 2.5% of this total—highlighting the urgent need for robust national and regional strategies that enhance the competitiveness and attractiveness of our higher education institutions. At the same time, this presents a significant opportunity for Arab universities to broaden their reach and benefit from the intellectual and cultural diversity that drives innovation and research.

At the Association of Arab Universities, we firmly believe that fostering academic openness is a cornerstone of sustainable development and an essential step toward positioning our region as a destination for high-quality, inclusive, and globally engaged education.

We are proud of the active involvement of Arab universities in this collective effort and reaffirm our commitment to supporting internationalization initiatives and strengthening the role of Arab higher education in the global academic landscape. Our shared future begins with a commitment to knowledge.

#### **103** Cooperation Agreements Signed at the Conclusion of the First Forum for **Arab Universities and International Recruitment Agencies**







Under the patronage of H.E. Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), the first Forum for Arab Universities and International Student Recruitment Agencies (AURAF) concluded its sessions on July 28–29 in Amman, Jordan. The event was jointly organized by AArU and Belgravia Advisers, with wide participation from universities representing seven Arab countries, alongside recruitment agencies and organizations from 42 Arab and foreign countries.

In his opening address, the Secretary-General emphasized that the forum comes at a critical time, as the higher education sector is undergoing fundamental transformations that position it as a strategic pillar for sustainable development. He stressed the importance of enhancing the international openness of Arab universities and their ability to attract students from around the world. He cited UNESCO data from 2023 indicating that international students now exceed 6.3 million globally, yet the MENA region accounts for only 3% of this total. Despite having over 1,000 universities, Arab institutions still host less than 2% international students.

Prof. Salama highlighted successful experiences of leading Arab universities—such as Cairo University, King Abdulaziz University, the University of Jordan, and the American University of Beirut—that have made significant progress in attracting international students by adopting English-language programs, signing global partnerships, and actively participating in international education fairs. He also praised national strategies in countries like Iraq, Egypt, the UAE, Jordan, Bahrain, and Morocco for supporting international student recruitment through visa facilitation, improved campus

environments, and policy reforms.

The Executive Director of AArU, Prof. Anas Ratib Alsoud, stated that the forum aimed to support Arab universities in enhancing their capacity to recruit international students from around the world by building strategic partnerships with accredited institutions in the global education sector. He affirmed that the forum's success was reflected in a strong institutional turnout. He added, the forum was a true launching point for building a more efficient and open Arab framework for academic marketing and student recruitment, grounded in transparency, quality, and innovation.

The forum featured keynote addresses from renowned international experts. Prof. Dana Redford, President of the PEEP Foundation for Education and Entrepreneurship Policy, presented an innovative perspective on the importance of creating "added value" in the international student experience. He emphasized that universities focusing on entrepreneurial and intercultural skills are better positioned to compete globally.

Prof. Ali Shams El Din, former President of Benha University and current President of EduGate, delivered a rich and insightful intervention, highlighting the challenges Arab universities face in academic internationalization. He stressed the need for a paradigm shift in institutional and administrative discourse and the importance of creating welcoming environments that align with global standards and celebrate cultural diversity. The forum also included two dynamic panel discussions on the future of student recruitment and the evolving role of agencies in fostering transparent and ethical ecosystems. In addition, direct networking sessions between universities and agents paved

the way for long-term, mutually beneficial partnerships that will serve both students and academic institutions.

The forum concluded with a strong call to action: to build upon its recommendations as a foundation for a unified Arab strategy to elevate the international standing of Arab universities and transform them from student-sending institutions into globally attractive destinations for academic and cultural exchange.

The event was attended by a host of high-ranking diplomatic and academic figures, who affirmed that H.E. Ambassador Dr. Abu Ghazaleh is a symbol of unwavering dedication. Her journey spans ministerial and parliamentary roles in Jordan, service at the United Nations, and a leadership position at the League of Arab States. Her previous nomination among the "1,000 Women for the Nobel Peace Prize" stands as early evidence of her profound influence on the Arab and international arenas.















#### The Association of Arab Universities and the Arab Planning Institute Sign Memorandum of Understanding to Enhance Cooperation in Development, Training, and Scientific Research







The Association of Arab Universities and the Arab Planning Institute – State of Kuwait signed a Memorandum of Understanding aimed at enhancing joint cooperation in the fields of training, capacity building, studies, research, and developmental events. This comes as part of joint efforts to support sustainable development and improve the efficiency of educational and research institutions in the Arab world.

The signing of this memorandum followed a series of constructive meetings and discussions between the two parties, during which potential areas of cooperation and the projects of both the Association and the Institute were reviewed. These discussions revealed strategic intersections in goals and visions, particularly in supporting innovation, empowering human resources, and improving the performance of higher education institutions.

The agreement was signed by His Excellency Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities, and Dr. Abdullah Fahad Al-Shami, Director General of the Arab Planning Institute, in the presence of representatives from both sides.

The Memorandum of Understanding aims to establish an institutional partnership based on the exchange of expertise and cooperation in implementing training programs,

providing consultancy services, organizing conferences and developmental forums, and developing joint studies and research addressing priority development issues in the Arab region.

During the signing, both parties emphasized the importance of this cooperation as a step toward strengthening joint Arab efforts. The Association of Arab Universities serves as a key platform for coordinating academic work and knowledge exchange among higher education institutions, while the Arab Planning Institute is a leading regional reference in strategic planning and capacity building.

The memorandum stipulates the establishment of clear mechanisms for implementing agreed-upon initiatives and the formation of joint coordination teams to follow up on the implementation of the agreement's provisions, ensuring its effectiveness and sustainability.



#### The association of Arab Universities **Explores Expansion of International Academic Partnerships**



As part of its ongoing efforts to strengthen Arab presence on the global academic stage. His Excellency Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama. Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), met with Mr. Ramon Torrent, Executive Director of OBREAL, during an official visit to the city of Barcelona. meeting focused on exploring opportunities for academic cooperation and the exchange of expertise between Arab universities and their counterparts across various regions of the world. This dialogue aligns with strategic efforts aimed at:

- Expanding the scope of research and scientific collaboration between Arab and international universities.
- Supporting academic dialogue building effective institutional partnerships at the global level.
- Enhancing the role of higher education institutions in addressing shared global challenges—particularly sustainability. climate change, and digital transformation.

The two sides also discussed the AArU's participation in high-level academic events scheduled for 2025, which aim to develop innovative solutions in education development, and to promote South-South cooperation amid accelerating geopolitical and environmental challenges.

Among the most notable upcoming events is the Third Interregional Dialogue on





Education and Development, set to be held in Bogotá, Colombia, from November 3 to 7, 2025. Coordination is currently underway between AArU and OBREAL to ensure strong engagement from Arab universities in this major international forum.

In the same context, H.E. Prof. Salama also met with Ms. Elisabeth Colucci, Deputy Secretary–General of OBREAL, to discuss the possibility of hosting the Fourth Interregional Dialogue in Amman in 2026, as well as areas of cooperation in vital fields such as energy, climate, water, and the environment. The discussions emphasized the need to develop international policy frameworks to address these challenges and affirmed the pivotal role of higher education and scientific research in delivering sustainable and effective solutions.

The Association of Arab Universities reaffirms its commitment to representing Arab universities on the international stage and to building academic bridges that serve our societies and align with the aspirations of future generations.





#### The Association of Arab Universities **Supports Scientific Education** through the BASE Project Funded by **Erasmus**+







As part of its unwavering commitment to enhancing the quality of higher education in the Arab world, the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), represented by H.E. Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General, participated in the administrative meeting of the Bologna for Science Education in Palestine and Jordan (BASE) project. The meeting was hosted by the University of Barcelona, Spain, with broad participation from partner universities and institutions from Palestine, Jordan, and several European countries.

The AArU delegation also included Prof. Walid Salameh, Advisor to the Secretary-General, and Ms. Lina Al-Bitar, Director of the General Administration at the General Secretariat.

In his opening remarks, H.E. Prof. Salama expressed his pride in participating in this significant event, which marks an important milestone in the effort to modernize science education programs in Palestine and Jordan. The project seeks to align these programs with the European Bologna Framework, thereby supporting the recognition of academic degrees, enhancing student and

faculty mobility, improving the quality of scientific output, and opening new avenues for regional and international collaboration.

He also emphasized the importance of aligning Arab higher education systems with European and international standards. Prof. Salama highlighted the pivotal role the Association of Arab Universities plays in disseminating the project's outcomes and promoting regional benefit. He further praised successful cases of Bologna model implementation, such as those in Tunisia and Morocco, and stressed the need to link scientific research with education and academic mobility to support a comprehensive and sustainable education system.



#### Coordination Meeting on the Implementation of the "Arab Higher Education Area" Initiative





On Wednesday, 9 July 2025, a virtual coordination meeting was held via Zoom, bringing together representatives from the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), the Arab League Educational, Cultural and Scientific Organization (ALECSO), and the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research of the Republic of Iraq. The meeting aimed to follow up on the implementation of the initiative to establish an Arab Higher Education Area, which was proposed by H.E. Prof. Dr. Naeem Al-Aboudi, Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research in Iraq, during the 56th session of the Association of Arab Universities Conference, held at the University of Baghdad.

The meeting focused on reviewing the implementation timeline and proposed roadmap for the initiative, which seeks to foster greater collaboration and

integration among higher education institutions across the Arab region. Participants discussed the detailed action plan, assigned responsibilities among partner organizations, and explored coordination mechanisms with relevant stakeholders in Arab countries. Potential funding sources to ensure the initiative's long-term sustainability were also addressed.

In closing, participants underscored the importance of ongoing coordination and collective action to implement the initiative within the agreed timeframe. The next coordination meeting is scheduled for late July 2025 to assess progress and review forthcoming steps.





### Secretary-General Visits Headquarters of CyberLaw / Qistas Information Technology Company.







As part of efforts to strengthen mutual cooperation, His Excellency Prof. Amr Salama, Secretary–General of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), paid a visit to the headquarters of CyberLaw / Qistas - Information Technology Company in Amman. During the visit, a coordination meeting was held with the company's team to follow up on the implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding signed between the two parties, aimed at establishing a strategic partnership in the fields of legal education and legal technology.

During the meeting, His Excellency emphasized the importance of this partnership in advancing the legal education ecosystem within Arab universities by integrating modern technologies, fostering scientific research, and supporting students' skills in law and digital transformation.

Both sides agreed to organize a joint Arab scientific conference focusing on the future of legal education in the Arab world, with the participation of prominent academic and legal experts. They also agreed to launch a series of training workshops targeting faculty members and students from law and science faculties in AArU's member universities.

The meeting further explored mechanisms for leveraging artificial intelligence to enrich legal educational content, including tools for legal text analysis, the design of interactive learning platforms, and the enhancement of access to modern legal knowledge resources—all aimed at updating legal curricula and improving educational outcomes.

The meeting was attended by Ms. Lina Albitar, Director of General Administration, and Mr.Ziad Amara, Director of the Secretary-General's Office.

This visit comes within the framework of the Association's vision to promote legal enhance collaboration with leading institutions innovation and technology—supporting academic and professional advancement across the Arab world.









#### Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities Participates in the General Assembly of the Mediterranean Universities Union (UNIMED) at the University of Calabria







His Excellency Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), participated in the General Assembly of the Mediterranean Universities Union (UNIMED), hosted by the University of Calabria in Italy.

In his opening remarks, His Excellency expressed his appreciation to UNIMED and the organizing institutions, affirming that this gathering reflects a shared belief in the pivotal role university networks play in building bridges of cooperation and creating genuine opportunities across the Mediterranean region.

The Secretary-General emphasized that internationalization is no longer limited to student and faculty mobility, but has become a strategic pillar in the development of modern universities. He highlighted the importance of integrating international dimensions into curricula, expanding research partnerships, and adhering to global

academic standards.

He also reviewed the key initiatives led by AArU in this field, including the organization of multi-regional leadership forums involving Arab, European, Chinese, Turkish, and Russian universities; supporting the Global University Associations Forum (GUAF) to strengthen collaboration with global university networks;



implementing the Arab-Chinese 10+10 Program to foster joint research and student exchange; and launching the Mediterranean Academy for Professional Excellence (MAPE) in May 2025 in Italy, aimed at bridging the gap between traditional academic education and labor market needs in the Mediterranean, especially for youth and women.

His Excellency praised the European Commission's initiative to establish a Euro-Mediterranean University Alliance and offered several key recommendations to ensure its success, including:

- Engaging Arab universities as equal partners in leadership.
- Aligning the alliance's priorities with regional challenges (e.g., climate change, migration, unemployment).
- Launching the initiative through joint pilot groups.
- Providing financial and technical support for universities in fragile contexts.
- Involving ministries of education to facilitate student mobility and qualification recognition.
- Ensuring the long-term financial sustainability of the initiative.

He concluded by highlighting the efforts of Arab universities in supporting refugees and students affected by conflict, including:

- Establishing a support fund for Palestinian universities.
- Implementing joint projects with UNHCR.
- University-led initiatives in Jordan to support Syrian refugees.
- A student support initiative for Palestinians in collaboration with the Kuwait Society for Student Relief.

In closing, the Secretary-General emphasized the need to develop balanced education systems that reflect the unique characteristics of each society, calling for partnerships based on trust and mutual respect to achieve the desired transformation in the Mediterranean region.





#### **High-Level Bilateral Meeting:** Secretary-General of the Association of **Arab Universities Explores Avenues of Cooperation with the President of the University of Barcelona**





As part of ongoing efforts to strengthen academic partnerships between the Arab world and Europe, His Excellency Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), held a high-level bilateral meeting with Prof. Joan Josep Garcia, President of the University of Barcelona, on July 4, 2025, in Barcelona.

The two sides discussed potential areas of collaboration between the University of Barcelona and AArU member universities. particularly in the development of joint research programs and the exchange of faculty and students. During the meeting, H.E. Prof. Salama presented Chinese-Arab "10+10" initiative as successful model of regional cooperation and proposed launching Euro-Mediterranean version the of initiative, involving ten Arab and ten European universities. The proposal was welcomed by the President of the University Barcelona. who of expressed the university's readiness to lead the initiative on the European side.

The two parties also agreed to organize a joint international conference in 2026, focusing on the future challenges of higher education across the Mediterranean region





and the role of artificial intelligence in this transformation. In addition, they plan to hold a series of periodic workshops on quality assurance and academic accreditation.

Both parties described the meeting as a new milestone toward a sustainable partnership. Prof. strategic Garcia emphasized that the University Barcelona regards the Association of Arab Universities as a key partner in advancing Euro-Arab academic dialogue, while H.E. Prof. Salama reaffirmed the Association's commitment to translating the outcomes of the meeting into concrete programs that support the development goals of Arab universities.

The meeting concluded with an agreement to draft a concept paper outlining the proposed cooperation and to form a joint committee to oversee its implementation, paving the way for the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding in the near future.

It is worth noting that the University of Barcelona, founded in 1450, is one of Europe's oldest and most prestigious universities. It ranks among the top 100 universities worldwide according to the QS World University Rankings and is renowned for its pioneering research, particularly in medicine and the humanities.


The program features a comprehensive curriculum that blends theoretical foundations with practical applications. Participants gain a deep understanding of AI






