of responding to a complex and ever-changing climate reality. According to data from the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the higher education sector has the potential to influence over 200 million university students worldwide, making it one of the key drivers of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals—particularly Goal 13 (Climate Action), Goal 4 (Quality Education), and Goal 17 (Partnerships for the Goals).

UNESCO's 2024 report on "Greening Education" reveals that less than



30% of universities worldwide have systematically integrated sustainability and climate issues into their academic curricula. The report also highlights a significant gap in investments in green infrastructure and university-led environmental awareness programs.

This reality confirms that greening higher education goes far beyond revising academic content—it requires a comprehensive institutional transformation that redefines the university's relationship with the environment and society. This transformation is embodied in the integration of environmental thinking into university policies, governance methods, planning, and daily academic practices.

In this context, the Association of Arab Universities calls on all higher education institutions in the Arab world to actively engage in this green transition—by developing curricula, launching research initiatives, and building partnerships with civil society, as well as public and private sectors—to strengthen the collective response to climate challenges.

We stand at a critical moment that demands our universities become sustainable learning environments, capable of graduating informed, empowered, and qualified generations who can lead the transformation toward a more just and prosperous future. Amman – Representing His Excellency Professor Dr. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities, Professor Dr. Anas Ratib Al-Soud, Executive Director of the Association, participated in a specialized dialogue session held on Sunday, June 29, 2025, entitled: "Digital Governance in the Public Sector in the Age of Artificial Intelligence." The event was hosted by Middle East University and jointly organized by the Association of Arab Universities and the Integrity and Anti-Corruption Commission of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.

The session was honored by the esteemed presence and inspiring insights of HRH Prince El Hassan bin Talal, who delivered the opening address. In his remarks, His Royal Highness emphasized the importance of strengthening good governance systems amid rapid digital transformation, highlighting both the opportunities and challenges that artificial intelligence presents to the public sector and society at large.

In his intervention, Dr. Al-Soud emphasized the importance of supporting the autonomy of universities to enable them to achieve good governance amid accelerating digital transformation. He also highlighted the efforts of the Association of Arab Universities in this regard, particularly in developing digital governance standards in higher education and fostering partnerships with national and regional integrity institutions.

This participation comes as part of the Association's commitment to supporting national initiatives that promote good governance and respond to technological transformations in the Arab world. It reflects the Association's role as a regional academic umbrella that works to harmonize the efforts of universities, policymakers, and national institutions.

It is worth noting that this dialogue session serves as a preparatory event for a regional Arab Forum on Governance, scheduled to be held later this year with the participation of distinguished Arab and international experts.



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Enhancing Academic Cooperation and Countering Extremist Ideologies: Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities Meets with Egypt's Minister of Awqaf





On Thursday, June 19, 2025, Professor Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities, accompanied by Dr. Randa Rizk, Secretary-General of the Arab Council for Social Responsibility within the Association, visited His Excellency Professor Osama Al-Azhari, Egypt's Minister of Awqaf, at the Ministry's headquarters in the New Administrative Capital.

The meeting explored avenues for strengthening collaboration between the Association of Arab Universities and the Egyptian Ministry of Awqaf, particularly in supporting endowment-based initiatives and confronting extremist ideologies. This cooperation will include joint initiatives and activities inspired by the book "The Clear Truth in Responding to Those Who Manipulate Religion", aimed at reinforcing the values of moderation and balance.

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Discussions also included the Ministry's efforts to promote awareness and centrist Islamic thought within university communities, as well as prospects for academic and intellectual cooperation with Nur-Mubarak University in Kazakhstan, a distinguished institution in Islamic studies and the dissemination of moderate Islamic thought.

During the meeting, the Minister of Awqaf expressed interest in enrolling Nur-Mubarak University as a member of the Association of Arab Universities, in recognition of its academic contributions and leadership in responsible religious education.

In response, Professor Salama highlighted that the Association includes over 500 universities from across the Arab world and is committed to enhancing academic cooperation and the exchange of expertise among its members. He also commended the Ministry's ongoing efforts in promoting enlightened thought and fostering a culture of tolerance and belonging.



AArU and UN-Habitat Establish Partnership to Promote Sustainable Urban Development







A meeting was held between the Association of Arab Universities (AArU) and the Regional Office of the United Nations Human Settlements Programme the H.E. (UN-Habitat). in presence of Dr. Amr Ezzat Salama. Secretary-General of AArU; Ms. Rania Hedeya, Country Programme Director at UN-Habitat; Mr. Ahmed Rizk, Head of the UN-Habitat Egypt Office; Dr. Randa Rizk, Secretary-General of the Arab Council for Social Responsibility; and Dr. Mohamed Azzam, Assistant Secretary-General of the Arab Council for Social Responsibility.

The meeting explored areas of mutual cooperation, including participation in the upcoming workshop and conference on promoting social responsibility to

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advance the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in partnership with the private sector. Discussions also addressed the organization of joint awareness activities between UN-Habitat and the Arab Council, engaging Arab universities in efforts to integrate urban planning and city design principles that support economic and social development and enhance quality of life.

The parties agreed to co-organize a joint conference and to launch initiatives encouraging research and innovation in the field of urban development. They also plan to design and implement collaborative projects to promote knowledge and experience exchange among Arab universities in urban planning and development—contributing to the advancement of the SDG agenda and enhancing the role of cities in achieving and sustaining a high quality of life for all citizens.

This visit served as a follow-up to the agreement previously signed between the two organizations, which aims to support business schools in Arab universities in obtaining this prestigious international academic accreditation.

The visit is part of a series of preparatory meetings to launch the "AACSB Affiliate Model" program, officially set to launch on July 1, 2025. The program offers valuable opportunities for Arab business schools to embark on the accreditation journey through reduced fees and comprehensive training programs covering all accreditation standards.

The launch of this initiative coincides with the introduction of a "Regional Accreditation for Business Schools," currently being developed by the Association of Arab Universities through its Council for Accreditation and Quality Assurance, in partnership with the Scientific Society for Business Administration and Economic Sciences. The initiative aims to align with international standards and elevate the global standing of Arab business schools.

The meeting was attended by Prof. Anas Ratib Al-Soud, Executive Director of AArU, Ms. Lina Al-Bitar, Director of General Administration, and Mr. Ahmad Atwah, Financial Manager.

This strategic collaboration reflects the Association's commitment to empowering its member institutions to engage in international accreditation frameworks and enhance the quality of education in Arab business schools.

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Meeting Between the Association of Arab Universities and the Egyptian Knowledge Bank: to Discuss Mechanisms for Activating the Memorandum of Understanding.

As part of ongoing strategic collaboration, the General Secretariat team of the Association of Arab Universities held a coordination meeting with a delegation from the Egyptian Knowledge Bank to follow up on the implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding signed between the two parties in late January 2025.

During the meeting, the parties discussed mechanisms to activate the terms of the agreement and reviewed the diverse digital and knowledge-based services provided by the Egyptian Knowledge Bank, aligning with the aspirations of the Association's member universities. The discussions focused on enhancing:

- •Access to the vast digital scientific content offered by the Egyptian Knowledge Bank, which is considered one of the largest digital libraries globally;
- •Educational services and academic resources, including e-books, peer-reviewed articles, technological learning tools, and scientific publishing services;
- Technical and administrative support to activate these services within academic libraries, ensuring effective utilization of this advanced platform.

It was also agreed to develop a comprehensive implementation framework to present these services to the member universities of the Association of Arab Universities. This will pave the way for the practical execution phases based on a defined timeline, aligned with the Association's 2020–2030 strategy and the broader digital transformation of higher education in the Arab world. The Association of Arab Universities Participates in a Scientific Seminar on Artificial Intelligence and Cybersecurity in Celebration of the 80th Anniversary of the Arab League.







As part of the celebrations marking the 80th anniversary of the founding of the League of Arab States, the Association of Arab Universities participated in a high-level scientific seminar titled "Artificial Intelligence and Cybersecurity", held on Sunday, June 1, 2025, at the Arab Academy for Science, Technology, and Maritime Transport in Smart Village – Cairo, Arab Republic of Egypt.

The General Secretariat of the Association was represented by Professor Dr. Mahmoud Abdel-Aty, who delivered a comprehensive presentation highlighting the Association's efforts to support the fields of artificial intelligence and cybersecurity within Arab universities. These efforts include the launch of pioneering initiatives, the organization of scientific conferences, and the establishment of strategic partnerships with regional and international academic and technological institutions.

In his address, Dr. Abdel-Aty emphasized that artificial intelligence is no longer optional but rather a necessity for achieving sustainable development and enhancing the quality of education and university governance. He stressed the importance of developing digital infrastructure in universities and preparing both academic staff and students to address the growing challenges of cybersecurity.

### Towards Good Governance in Arab Universities: A Coordinating Meeting to Launch an Ambitious Regional Project



As part of the Association of Arab Universities' ongoing efforts to promote the principles of good governance in higher education institutions across the Arab world. Professor Dr. Anas Rateb Al-Saud, Executive Director of the Association. under the guidance of His Excellency Secretary-General Professor Dr. Amr Ezzat Salama, participated today in a coordinating meeting held at the regional headquarters of the United Development Nations Programme (UNDP) in Amman, Jordan.



The meeting was attended by Mr. Arkan El Seblani, UNDP Senior Advisor for the Arab States and Head of the Regional Anti-Corruption and Integrity in the Arab Countries Project, Dr. Haitham Yaseen, Regional Governance Advisor at UNDP, and Professor Dr. Ahmed Saqr Ashour, International Governance Expert and Professor of Management at Alexandria University.

The meeting discussed the key outlines of a joint project between the Association and UNDP aimed at enhancing governance in Arab universities through the development of legislative and regulatory frameworks, capacity building, and the adoption of global best practices. The project seeks to elevate the quality of university education and improve institutional performance across the region.

Dr. Al-Saud reaffirmed the Association's commitment to supporting Arab universities in their pursuit of excellence by promoting transparency, accountability, participation, and by linking governance to digital transformation, strategic planning, and academic accreditation.

The full details of the project are expected to be announced soon, in preparation for its official launch, with the participation of leading Arab universities and institutions concerned with higher education and good governance in the Arab region.

# AArU Participates in the Meeting of the SAFIE in the Sultanate of Oman







As part of its commitment to supporting faculties of education and enhancing their pivotal role in advancing educational systems in the Arab world, the Association of Arab Universities (AArU) participated in the meeting of the Executive Committee of the Scientific Association of Faculties and Institutes of Education in Arab Universities (SAFIE), one of the institutions affiliated with the Association.

The meeting featured a rich academic discussion led by Professor Dr. Iman Ibrahim Ezz, Secretary–General of the Scientific Association of Faculties and Institutes of Education in Arab Universities, from the University of Damascus. She announced the Association's intention to organize a specialized scientific conference on Trauma–Informed Teaching at the University of Damascus in Syria by the end of the year, with participation from a distinguished group of Arab scholars and academics.

This engagement is part of the broader mission of the Association of Arab Universities to foster collaboration and integration among academic institutions and to support modern educational approaches that serve the future of education in the Arab world.



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# Seminar titled: "The Role of Social Responsibility in Community Security"





On May 13, 2025, the Council for Social Responsibility of Arab Universities hosted a virtual seminar featuring charitable organizations to discuss their experiences in social responsibility. Professor Dr. Yousef Thiab Awad, Director of the Council, highlighted the vital role of these organizations, particularly in Palestine, given the difficult and tense circumstances faced there.

Dr. Alaa MaqbouL, President of the Al-Tadamun Charity Association in Nablus, praised the organization's growing efforts in serving marginalized groups, with a particular focus on supporting patients and orphans. He also emphasized the association's developmental approach through the establishment of income-generating projects aimed at empowering underprivileged families to achieve self-sufficiency.

The seminar also shed light on the increasing volume of medical, relief, and social aid being provided. Mr. Saeed Hindieh, Vice President of the Al-Tadamun Charity Association, drew a link between community security and national security, stating that meeting citizens' needs directly contributes to a country's stability, safety, and prosperity.

Additionally, the Council hosted Mr. Ahmad Dwaikat, who shared insights into the work of the Madeed Charity Association and its comprehensive programs aimed at addressing the basic needs of the underprivileged. These programs target marginalized populations—including those in remote areas, individuals with disabilities, orphans, and patients—through the provision of food, clothing, and financial aid. Both associations also emphasized the importance of sharing beneficiary data to avoid duplication and ensure fair distribution, especially for those on waiting lists.

In conclusion, participants—including students, institutions, and individual stakeholders—expressed their appreciation for the pivotal role charitable organizations play in strengthening community security. They stressed that such security cannot be achieved without meeting the basic living needs of individuals, underscoring the positive impact this has on internal security due to the interdependent relationship between both spheres.
