Conclusion of the Fifth Conference of Arab-Turkish Presidents' congress in Tunisia and the Issuance of the "Tunis Joint Declaration"









The Fifth Conference of Arab-Turkish Presidents' congress was held in the Republic of Tunisia on October 10–11, 2025, with the participation of more than 100 Arab and Turkish universities, as part of efforts to strengthen academic and scientific cooperation between higher education institutions in the Arab world and the Republic of Türkiye.

The conference was jointly organized by the General Secretariat of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), the University of Tunis El Manar, the Council of Higher Education of the Republic of Türkiye (YÖK), and the Eurasian Universities Union (EURAS).

The event witnessed high-level participation, led by H.E. Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities; H.E. Prof. Moncef Boukthir, Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research of the Republic of Tunisia; Prof. Moez Chafra, President of the University of Tunis El Manar; Prof. Erol Özvar, President of the Council of Higher Education of the Republic of Türkiye (YÖK); and Prof. Mustafa Aydın, President of the Eurasian Universities Union (EURAS). The conference was also attended by a large number of university presidents, academic leaders, and experts in higher education and scientific research.

The conference featured scientific sessions and extensive discussions that explored ways to enhance academic partnerships and promote scientific and cultural exchange between universities. Participants also addressed current challenges facing higher education and examined the role of universities in driving digital transformation, sustainability, and innovation.

During the event, more than 150 cooperation agreements were signed between Arab and Turkish universities in areas including scientific research, student and faculty exchange, and joint academic projects—reflecting the depth of academic relations between both sides and their shared commitment to advancing future collaboration.

The conference concluded with the adoption of an important document titled the "Tunis Joint Declaration", held under the theme: "Transforming Higher Education through Leadership, Innovation, and Regional Integration."

The declaration was jointly endorsed by the Council of Higher Education of the Republic of Türkiye (YÖK), the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), and the Eurasian Universities Union (EURAS).

It outlined five main pillars:

- Leadership and Governance: Enhancing university leadership capacities and developing institutional governance systems.
- Innovation and Scientific Research: Establishing joint research and innovation centers in areas such as digital transformation, artificial intelligence, health, and sustainability.
- Regional Integration: Supporting academic exchange programs, scholarships, and joint summer schools among universities.
- Sustainable Development: Aligning academic cooperation with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- Implementation and Follow-up Mechanism: Forming a joint task force representing the three

partner institutions to oversee the implementation and activation of the declaration's provisions.

At the conclusion of the conference, participants expressed their deep appreciation for the exceptional efforts of the General Secretariat of the Association of Arab Universities, the University of Tunis El Manar, the Council of Higher Education of the Republic of Türkiye, and the Eurasian Universities Union (EURAS) for their excellent organization and warm hospitality.

They reaffirmed the importance of sustaining this constructive academic cooperation, which contributes to the advancement of higher education and strengthens bridges of partnership between Arab and Turkish universities.







































The Second International Conference of Universities and Artificial Intelligence Technology – How AI is Reshaping the Future of Higher Education? in Amman







Amman, October 19, 2025 – The two-day International Conference on "Artificial Intelligence in Higher Education", organized by the Association of Arab Universities (AArU) in partnership with the China Association of Higher Education (CAHE), concluded today in Amman after a series of insightful discussions, keynote lectures, and collaborative dialogues between Arab and Chinese universities.

The conference gathered ministers,

university presidents, researchers, experts, and students to explore the growing impact of Artificial Intelligence on higher education, institutional governance, and academic innovation.





Conference Highlights:

- 1. 50+ research papers submitted and presented by leading academics and specialists.
- 2. Participation of over 250 experts and representatives from 15+ Arab and Chinese universities.
- 3. 4 plenary lectures and 3 interactive panel discussions, along with distinguished sessions
- 4. addressing governance, innovation, competitiveness, and strategic partnerships in Al.

The conference affirmed that Artificial Intelligence represents a pivotal turning point for the future of higher education. Institutions must transition from being mere consumers of technology to becoming its producers and innovators. Participants and researchers agreed on the necessity of developing national and internal strategies to integrate AI tools into teaching processes across all disciplines, stressing its importance in line with global trends, as well as in scientific research and university administration, with a focus on personalized learning for every student. The conference also emphasized the critical importance of developing the digital and ethical competencies of faculty members and students and ensuring the establishment of strict ethical frameworks for using these technologies to guarantee fairness and transparency in educational outcomes, thereby qualifying graduates for the future job market.



























































Exploring How Artificial Intelligence is Transforming Higher Education





As part of the Second International Conference on Artificial Intelligence in Higher Education, leading scholars and experts from the Arab world, China, and Europe engaged in thought-provoking lectures and dynamic panel discussions exploring the transformative impact of Al on learning, research, governance, and institutional development.

Inspiring Lectures and Insights

Distinguished speakers presented diverse perspectives on how Artificial Intelligence is redefining higher education ecosystems worldwide:

Prof. XU Hao, Director of Jilin University Library and Professor at the College of Computer Science and Technology, delivered an insightful lecture on how AI is reshaping academic research and higher education. He highlighted key global trends in AI-driven learning and discussed how Jilin University is pioneering personalized, self-directed, and research-oriented educational models. Prof. Xu emphasized that the future of universities lies in integrating AI across academic and administrative systems to drive innovation and excellence.

Prof. Hamad Odhabi, Abu Dhabi University, shared forward-looking insights on enhancing educational quality and efficiency through Al. He introduced the VIBE Coding framework, a transformative model enabling universities to embed Al within their processes to create tangible value for students, faculty, and the wider community. Prof. Odhabi underscored that adopting Al is fundamental for fostering innovation and sustainability in higher education.

Prof. Jorge Marx Gomez, University of Oldenburg, Germany, addressed the intersection of Sustainability and AI in Education, emphasizing the importance of aligning technological advancement with environmental and social responsibility.

Prof. Mouna Abdelaal, Ain Shams University, Egypt, explored AI for Quality and Teaching Excellence, highlighting best practices and strategies to leverage AI in achieving continuous academic improvement.

Together, these lectures shed light on the critical role of Artificial Intelligence in shaping the universities of the future—smarter, more adaptive, and globally competitive.





Engaging Panel Discussions

Complementing the keynote lectures, a series of high-level panel discussions brought together academic leaders and experts to explore how Al is redefining higher education systems and partnerships:

Panel Discussion 1 – Al and Institutional Transformation: Governance, Innovation, and Global Competitiveness Moderated by Prof. Anas Al-Soud, Executive Director of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), this session featured distinguished speakers from Jordan, the UAE, Egypt, and China. Discussions focused on integrating Al into governance models, promoting data-driven decision-making, and fostering innovation to strengthen institutional agility and competitiveness.

Panel Discussion 2 – How AI is Reshaping the Future of Higher Education Moderated by Prof. Walid Salameh, Senior Consultant at AArU, this discussion examined AI's role in transforming teaching and learning, emphasizing digital skills, ethical frameworks, and collaborative initiatives between Arab and Chinese universities to build future-ready education systems.

Panel Discussion 3 – Building a Shared Future: Strategic Partnerships between Arab and Chinese Universities in Al Moderated by Dr. Ma Song, the session focused on enhancing academic cooperation, joint research, and digital transformation strategies. Experts emphasized the importance of developing sustainable Arab–Chinese partnerships to advance Al-driven innovation and excellence.

Collectively, these lectures and discussions underscored that Artificial Intelligence is not merely a technological advancement but a strategic enabler of innovation, transparency, and global collaboration—driving higher education toward a more intelligent and inclusive future.







China-Arab Universities 10+10 Cooperation Program Annual Meeting Held in Amman





Amman, Jordan – October 18, 2025 The Association of Arab Universities (AArU), in cooperation with the China Association of Higher Education (CAHE), organized the annual meeting of the China–Arab Universities 10+10 Cooperation Program in Amman, Jordan. The gathering brought together presidents and representatives from leading Arab and Chinese universities to review the progress achieved under the 10+10 initiative and to explore new avenues for collaboration in research, innovation, and student mobility.

The opening session featured welcoming remarks by H.E. Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities; Prof. Li Jiajun, Vice Chairman of the China Association of Higher Education; and H.E. Gong Anmin, Chargé d'Affaires of the Chinese Embassy in Jordan.

In his address, Prof. Salama highlighted the growing success of the 10+10 Cooperation Program, describing it as "a bridge of mutual learning, innovation, and friendship between two ancient civilizations." He commended the tangible outcomes of the program, including joint research in sustainable energy, student exchange programs, and the co-development of academic and scientific projects in key fields such as artificial intelligence, green technology, and cultural studies.









Prof. Salama also called upon universities from both sides to strengthen collaboration through joint research clusters, enhance the quality of academic exchanges, and expand mobility programs that promote cultural understanding and intellectual exchange.

The meeting included detailed progress reports from both secretariats of the China–Arab Consortium of Universities Exchange Mechanism - presented by Dr. Ma Sang from Shanghai International Studies University (Chinese Secretariat) and Ms. Lina Albitar from AArU.

The program also featured the announcement of several new cooperation initiatives, including joint projects in economic, trade, and investment fields, as well as information and communication technology. Additionally, the Digital Education Platform (International Edition) was presented, followed by the official launch of the Consortium's website and logo, which aim to enhance digital connectivity and facilitate institutional cooperation.

The China-Arab Universities 10+10 Cooperation Program continues to serve as a cornerstone for fostering mutual understanding, innovation, and progress in higher

























Preparatory Meeting at the Iraqi Ministry of Higher Education to Discuss Implementation Plans for the "Arab Higher Education Area" Initiative







On Monday and Tuesday, October 7-8, 2025, a preparatory meeting was held at the headquarters of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research of the Republic of Iraq to discuss the implementation plans for launching the "Arab Higher Education Area" initiative. The initiative is led by the Iraqi Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), and the Arab Organization for Education, Culture and Science (ALECSO). It aims to enhance mutual recognition of academic degrees among Arab countries, facilitate academic mobility for students and faculty members, and improve the quality of higher education across the





Arab world.

The meeting included representatives from the Iraqi Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, headed by Prof. Dr. Bahaa Ansaf, President of the University of Baghdad, and Dr. Hazem Bager Tahir, Director General of the Department of Scholarships and Cultural Relations; a delegation from Association of Arab Universities, led by Prof. Dr. Anas Ratib Alsoud, Executive Director of the Association, accompanied by Prof. Dr. Walid Salameh, Advisor to the Association, and Mr. Ahmad Atwa, Financial Director; and a delegation from ALECSO, headed by Prof. Dr. Mohammad Abu Darwish, Director of the Department of Science and Scientific Research.

During the meeting, Dr. Anas Alsoud presented the vision of H.E. Prof. Dr. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities, regarding the structure and objectives of this Arab initiative launched by the Iraqi Ministry of Higher Education and adopted by the Council of Arab Ministers of Higher Education.

Prof. Dr. Walid Salameh delivered a detailed presentation outlining the initiative's goals, expected outcomes, and



potential implementation challenges. Participants discussed practical proposals and mechanisms to ensure the initiative's success and the achievement of its objectives.

At the conclusion of the meetings, participants agreed on several next-phase implementation steps, including that the Association of Arab Universities will select a group of Arab universities to participate in the pilot phase of the initiative. The initiative is scheduled to be formally presented during the meeting of the Arab Ministers of Higher Education in December 2025, as part of the 20th session of the Conference, in preparation for its official launch as one of the most significant joint Arab initiatives in advancing higher education and regional integration.

The Association of Arab Universities reaffirmed the importance of joint cooperation and coordination among all Arab stakeholders in higher education to ensure the initiative's success and realize its vision of establishing a unified Arab Higher Education Area—one that strengthens academic quality, supports scientific and student mobility, and enhances integration among Arab higher-education institutions.







Association of Arab Universities and the Egyptian Ministry of Higher Education Explore the Activation of the "Egyptian Knowledge Bank-International" Agreement to Serve Arab Universities







Cairo - Monday, October 13, 2025

His Excellency Professor Mohamed Ayman Ashour, Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research of Egypt, met today at the Ministry's headquarters with His Excellency Professor Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities. The meeting was attended by Professor Anas Rateb Al-Soud, Executive Director of the Association, Ms. Lina Al-Bitar, Director of the General Administration, and from the Egyptian Knowledge Bank, Dr. Gina Al-Feki, General Supervisor, and Eng. Majed Al-Sadeq, Secretary-General. The discussion focused on mechanisms for implementing the "Egyptian Knowledge Bank-International" agreement and expanding its services to benefit Arab universities.

During the meeting, the two sides reviewed ways to provide access to scientific content, databases, and digital educational resources through the Knowledge Bank for students, faculty members, and researchers in Arab universities. The initiative aims to enhance access to and exchange of knowledge while improving the quality of education and scientific research in the region.



The meeting also included agreement on an implementation roadmap outlining clear technical and timeline phases to integrate the Egyptian Knowledge Bank platforms with those of Arab universities. It further addressed the preparation of a specialized training program for the technical teams responsible for the project to optimize the use of the Bank's resources and analytical tools. Additionally, the discussion covered mechanisms for gradual expansion to include advanced services such as citation analytics, program evaluation support, and assistance for digital transformation initiatives in universities.

Both parties emphasized the importance of unifying Arab efforts to leverage Egypt's robust knowledge infrastructure and to extend the successful Egyptian Knowledge Bank model to a broader regional scope in alignment with the priorities of higher education and scientific research in the Arab world.

The joint working team will continue to hold periodic meetings in the coming weeks to finalize the technical and legal aspects of the collaboration.

Association of Arab Universities Organizes Specialized Training on "Introduction to ABET Accreditation" in Iraq





Baghdad, Republic of Iraq – October 9, 2025 – The Association of Arab Universities, in cooperation with the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research of the Republic of Iraq, organized a specialized training course titled "Introduction to ABET Accreditation", hosted by Al-Shaab University over two days, with the participation of 124 academics and specialists from various Iraqi universities.

The course was delivered by Prof. Waleed Salameh, Advisor to the Secretary-General of Association of Arab Universities and an expert in academic accreditation (ABET), and Prof. Ammar Al-Rashdan, distinguished expert in quality academic assurance and accreditation with extensive academic.

administrative, and industrial experience in the United Kingdom, the Middle East and North Africa, and Jordan.







The training aimed to:

- 1. Understand the fundamentals of Quality Assurance (QA), accreditation, and the National Qualifications Framework (NQF).
- 2. Recognize sustainable QA procedures, data management practices, and common challenges and opportunities in accreditation.
- 3. Familiarize themselves with ABET criteria, requirements, and the role of the Computing Accreditation Commission (CAC) and Engineering Accreditation Commission (EAC).
- 4. Analyze lessons learned from previous ABET experiences and apply them to their own institutional context.
- 5. Develop skills in student outcome assessment using ADAMS, with emphasis on data reuse and transforming data into actionable information.
- 6. Explore future directions in QA, including the integration of Artificial Intelligence (AI).
- 7. Appreciate QA as an institutional culture and collective responsibility for continuous improvement.

This initiative reflects the Association of Arab Universities' commitment to enhancing the capabilities of Arab universities in quality assurance and academic accreditation and to supporting the continuous development and improvement of higher education institutions, strengthening their competitiveness at regional and international levels.









AArU Secretary-General Participates in the GRC Regional Meeting on Equity-Based Science, Technology, and Innovation







Cairo, Egypt – October 14–15, 2025

Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities (AArU), participated in the Global Research Council (GRC) Regional Meeting for the Middle East and North Africa, held under the theme "Equity-Based Science, Technology and Innovation for Inclusive Human Development and Global Sustainability."

The meeting was hosted by the Academy of Scientific Research and Technology (ASRT), Egypt, in cooperation with the King Abdulaziz City for Science and Technology (KACST), Saudi Arabia, and the Kuwait Foundation for the Advancement of Sciences (KFAS), with the participation of high-level representatives from regional and international research councils, universities, and innovation bodies.

During the session titled "Research for Sustainable Communities," Prof. Salama delivered a keynote address highlighting the essential role of scientific research and higher education in advancing sustainability and community resilience across the Arab region.

He emphasized that achieving sustainable development requires linking research with local community priorities, ensuring equity and inclusion in science policy, and fostering interdisciplinary collaboration to address pressing challenges such as climate change, rapid urbanization, and resource scarcity.

Prof. Salama also showcased Egypt's national experience in research for sustainable communities, presenting successful models such as the "Haya Karima" (Decent Life) Initiative-a flagship program for rural development that integrates research, innovation, and social empowerment.

The two-day meeting gathered experts and policymakers from Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Qatar, Oman, and other countries to discuss key issues including inclusive open science, artificial intelligence for sustainability, equality and diversity in research, and responsible research assessment.

Preparatory Meeting for hosting the 2nd India–Arab Universities Presidents' Conference at Ajman University







On Friday morning, His Excellency Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities, accompanied by Prof. Anas Ratib Alsoud, Executive Director of the Association, and Ms. Lina Albitar, Director of General Administration, paid an official visit to Ajman University.

They were warmly received by Prof. Karim Seghir, Chancellor of Ajman University, and his distinguished leadership team. The meeting came as part of the preparations for the 2nd India–Arab Universities Presidents' Conference, which will be hosted by Ajman University in the United Arab Emirates on 11–12 February 2026.

This conference represents a significant milestone in the journey of academic cooperation, jointly organized by the Association of Arab Universities, the General Secretariat of the League of Arab States, the Ministry of External Affairs of India, the University Grants Commission (UGC), and the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). It aims to build on the

momentum of the first edition held earlier this year in New Delhi and to further strengthen collaboration between higher education institutions across the Arab world and India.






The Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities Participates in the 11th International Conference on the Arabic Language and the Mohamed bin Rashid Arabic Language Award in Dubai







Prof. Amr Ezzat Salama, Secretary-General of the Association of Arab Universities, participated in the 11th International Conference on the Arabic Language, held from 22 to 24 October 2025, in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, which also hosted the presentation of the Mohamed bin Rashid Arabic Language Award.

In his speech at the conference, the Secretary-General praised the patronage of His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President of the UAE, Prime Minister, and Ruler of Dubai, as well as his continuous support for Arabic language initiatives. He highlighted that the Mohamed bin Rashid Award has become the largest and most prestigious award in the history of the Arabic language, recognizing the outstanding contributions of individuals and institutions in serving the language. He also commended Dubai's role as a global example in leveraging technology to support cultural and linguistic identity in the digital era.

The Secretary-General emphasized that the Arabic language has, throughout the centuries, been a vessel of thought, science, and human creativity, contributing to the transmission of knowledge in medicine, chemistry, astronomy, engineering, and philosophy to the world. Today, more than 470 million people speak Arabic, it is the official language of 22 countries, the language of worship for nearly two billion Muslims, and is taught in over 1,900 universities worldwide, including Harvard, Oxford, and the Sorbonne, reflecting its growing cultural and intellectual significance globally.







He also addressed the challenges facing Arabic in the digital era, including limited support from artificial intelligence systems, the small share of Arabic content online compared to other languages, the gap between Modern Standard Arabic and local dialects, weak Arabization and translation policies, and the need for better coordination among academic institutions and language academies.

The Secretary-General stressed that promoting the Arabic language is a shared responsibility among universities, governments, and the private sector. He called for the adoption of national and regional policies to develop scientific and technical content in Arabic, the establishment of specialized centers for Arabic language computing, expansion of translation and Arabization efforts, and enrichment of Arabic digital content to reach 10% of global online content in the coming years.

He praised the central role of Arab universities in protecting the language, Arabizing scientific knowledge, standardizing terminology, training academic and research staff, and encouraging scientific publishing in Arabic. He emphasized that honoring the winners of the Mohamed bin Rashid Award recognizes all those dedicated to preserving and revitalizing the Arabic language as a living, evolving medium capable of meeting the demands of the modern era.




